PENANG

Day 01 Arrive KLIA/Penang

Upon arrival at KLIA, Meet and Greet Personal will meet you at the arrival gate and will escort you to your connection flight.

Welcome to Penang, The Pearl of the Orient !

Your friendly and knowledgeable English-speaking guide will meet you.
Upon arrival, ladies dressed in traditional costumes will present your guests with fresh orchid garland.

We drive towards Gurney Drive, along the north coast used to be lined with seaside bungalows and casuarinas trees. Penang's most popular esplanade, the 2km long seafront Gurney drive is where the elderly come early in the morning for their morning walks.

Take a trishaw ride along Gurney Drive and admire the seafront colonial heritage buildings in Penang whilst enjoy the beautiful sunset! Finally transfer to a local restaurant for an exquisite 8-course Chinese/seafood dinner including lobster.

Day 02

Option 1 : LOCAL MARKET & TEMPLE TOUR (Duration : 3hours)



Take a drive to Ayer Itam, explore the central park of the island starting with Ayer Itam – a bustling market, where you will find local folks in their daily chores, scenes in a wet market. A scene not to be missed!

Next, we visit Kek Lok Si Temple – the largest Buddhist temple in South East Asia, constructed in 1890, resplendent with its pagoda of 10 000 precious Buddha's displaying a mixture of Chinese, Thai and Burmese craftsmanship. The steps from Ayer Itam village up to the temple have an astonishing array of trinkets and souvenirs for sale. Learn a trick or two in the art of bargaining - a part of the lives of Malaysians. Famous poets and calligraphers inscribed large boulders set in the hill with Chinese verses.

Optional : Seafood Lunch at a Local Restaurant.

Eden Seafood Village, a Penang theatre-style restaurant is reputed to be the biggest seafood restaurant in Malaysia. As you walk along the long corridor towards the dining tables...marvel at or pick and choose live seafood from the impressive rows of 36 large seafood tanks featuring varieties of seafood to suit all connoisseurs.

OPTIONAL : Evening : FUSION DINNER AT 68 KELAWEI

(Classy type restaurant , with a cosy atmosphere)

68 Kelawei, as the restaurant is called, is one of those things that one should not judge by its "looks" but by the "beauty" that lies within.

You are in for a big surprise stepping into the restaurant, for the posh ness and elegance inside is a far cry from the plain, whitewashed, 50s-style bungalow exterior.

This evening, Fusion cuisine awaits you in the midst of a tastefully decorated restaurant. Here, the wooden furniture is complemented by the golden-coloured sheer organza that drapes every pillar and forms billowy curtains, giving the restaurant that expensive and classy look.

Option 1 : DISCOVER – SECRETS OF GEORGETOWN



Georgetown is a historic city of terra cotta roofs, stucco ornamentation and friendly sidewalks.

We start at Fort Cornwallis where Captain Francis Light first set foot on Penang in 1786. Then, we move along to the jetty front, an assortment of ramshackle wooden houses protrude out to the sea, perched precariously on wooden stilts – The waterfront clan villages and learn from your guide the history of these community's way of life.

Continue towards Jalan Masjid Kapitan Kling, home of the major religions in the world with a Buddhist temple, an Indian Temple and a Mosque next to each other. A small alley, just opposite Cannon Street will bring you to the Khoo Kongsi Clan House – the most elaborate and magnificent of all clan houses in Penang for its striking red and gold roof.

KL Tower is the tallest tower in South East Asia with beautiful architectural design and motive illustrate the rich Islamic heritage and successfully blending Eastern architecture with Western technology to built an elegant tower.

Dinner will take place at the revolving restaurant, situated 282 meters above the ground, and offers a commanding view of the city. The view from the restaurant itself is said to be better than that of the observation tower! Maximum capacity of restaurant is 220 persons.

The restaurant serves a very generous spread of international and Malaysian food, guaranteed to whet your appetite, buffet style!

DISCOVER KUALA LUMPUR (3.5 hrs)



We then get acquainted with the exciting landmarks of the city. We will visit the Lake Gardens, which boasts of a beautiful Orchid Garden, a Butterfly Park and a Bird Park. We then walk to the National Monument where you will get an impressive view of the Parliament Building in the background. Then, a stop at the King's Palace before we proceed to the National Mosque where you will also catch a glimpse of the Moorish architecture of Kuala Lumpur 's famous railway station, which has come to be described as a Byzantine Arabian nights fantasyland. Finally, we make a stop at the Independence Square with the High Court Building across the road, which was served as a Government administrative building.

ENHANCEMENTS:

Optional: Dim Sum lunch will be served at a local Chinese restaurant.

Dim Sum - The Chinese call the little delicacies served at tea lunch dim sum, which translates as "touching your heart." And that indeed is what these small morsels do. The advantage of sampling them at a teahouse is the great variety available. It may take you several visits to determine your favorites. There are steamed shrimp and pork dumplings, deep-fried egg rolls and taro-root dumplings, green peppers with shrimp filling, and on and on.

OPTIONAL: After lunch we will be on our way to.....Souvenir Hunt (3 hrs)

Souvenir hunters can't go wrong taking home some Malaysian handicraft which range from intricate silver, brass and pewter items to pottery, rattan and wickerwork. Batiks of silk and cotton come in attractive colors and patterns.

The two-story Handicraft Complex, once called the Karyaneka Handicraft Centre, is the ideal place to learn about Malaysia's handicrafts and do some serious souvenir shopping.



Next stop to a Batik Factory where you can witness the design process. The word 'batik' means 'writing in wax' and has now become a generic term for the art of wax painting on fabric. Here, you will even be given an opportunity to try your hand at creating your own design.

Last but not least is Malaysian very own "Royal Selangor Pewter" Visit to Royal Selangor Pewter Factory – the world's biggest pewter produces the world's finest pewter. This tour will guide you through the painstaking and detailed pewter-making process.

Enhancement:

Enroll at the School of Hard Knocks (1.5 hrs)



Here you can create your own pewter masterpiece while you re-live the experience of olden-day pewtersmithing.

With just a few simple tools (hammer, mallet, wooden mould and scraper), you will be guided through the processes of forming, scraping, polishing and packing by our experienced pewtersmith to craft your own pewter dish.

The finished dish engraved with your initials or other message is yours to keep along with your 'apprentice pewtersmith' apron and a personalised certificate to attest to your newfound skills

Option 1 : EVENING : MARKET TOUR WITH CASUAL DINNER AT LOCAL RESTAURANT

A visit to Kuala Lumpur is never complete without a stop at the famed Chinatown. The night market here is a place where you find all the branded items such as handbags, clothes, watches, cds, vcds, dvds, and lots more at very cheap prices – of course the items sold are "genuine imitations" or pirated copy.
