### A Malay Culture Fest

Although Malay *kampungs* have pretty much disappeared from the city landscape as a result of rapid urbanisation, discover the spirit of caring and sharing of a typical Malay community in a Malay village on the outskirts of Kuala Lumpur. Good old *kampung* days, which showcase the traditional lifestyles and Malay culture during the 50s and 60s, will be revived. View an interesting collection of artefacts, enjoy a documentary or participate in a typical wedding ceremony – all in rich cultural heritage of the Malays. At the strike of the *kompang* (traditional Malay hand drums), your guests will be led to the dining hall where a traditional style dinner will be served. Dinner will be accompanied with short acts by the Royal Dancers and a bamboo dance performance will be the highlight of the evening.

## Street Party At Central Market

50 years ago, this place was a wet market. Today, your guests will spend an evening partying in Central Market, an art-deco structure for the display and development of Malaysian culture, arts and crafts. Central Market, buzzing with sounds, colours and liveliness will be transformed into a street carnival-like atmosphere. Upon arrival, a traditional Chinese lion dance will greet your guests and each will receive an *angpow* (a red envelope) with a personal welcome message from the company management. The *angpow* is traditionally known as a symbol of good luck and prosperity. While enjoying pre-dinner cocktail, experience the various performances, demonstrations and activities in store. Guests can have their portrait painted at the artist's corner or their future predicted by the fortune teller. Artistic skills can be tested at batik painting or glass blowing. Guests can catch shadow puppet plays or the daring acts of the snakeman. Despite the various colourful attractions, one can't miss the hawker food stalls lined along the street featuring scrumptious Malaysian cuisine and delicacies. Dinner in KL wouldn't be the same without sampling food from the kitchens of Malaysia's multi races. The finale will be a vibrant and colourful cultural song and dance performance where they can learn some traditional Malay folk dances. Each stall will feature a different country's speciality. Be it *Sashimi* from Japan or *Mee Bandung* from Indonesia, each stall will be distinctively differentiated with its own décor, e.g. Japanese rice paper lantern, Indonesian native beads and masks, Thai wax-coated umbrellas. Clowns, magicians, a caricature artist, a fortune teller, a Chinese calligrapher, a batik painter, a candy man, an Indian flower lady, a Chinese name seal maker will be located strategically to entertain guests with their special skills.
